# SONOMA HORSE PARK EQUINE HEALTH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

\*PLEASE NOTE\* All heath requirements may be fluid prior to the start of competition. Please ensure that the <u>most recent</u> health requirements are met. All requirements will be posted to the website and widely released with ample time to be completed. Email <u>biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com</u> with any questions or concerns. Management will closely monitor all health related information and consult with USEF and facility veterinarians to ensure the safety of all competitors. The following are the current health entry requirements as of publication of this document.

## EVENT PARTICIPATION DECLARATION - REQUIRED

Signed by the owner/agent/trainer verifying that the horse has been healthy with no sign of infectious disease and has not had a fever above 102°F within 72 hours (3days) of arrival. Required for all horses entering Sonoma Horse Park Show Grounds both Showing and Non-Showing. Event Participation Declaration Form available at sonomahorsepark.com. This documentation must be submitted <u>prior</u> to arrival to <u>biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com</u> and hard copies <u>must</u> accompany all horses arriving at Sonoma Horse Park. A new Event Participation Declaration Form must be filed each time the horse enters the property. Horses stabled off the property that ship-in for their classes must comply with this requirement.

## PROOF OF VACCINATION - REQUIRED

Signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

- Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza (EIV)
- Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)
- If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number.

## TEMPERATURE LOG - REQUIRED

Temperature log that shows each horse entering the property has had their temperature checked twice daily for three (3) days prior to entry on the competition grounds. Temperature must be clearly recorded and no horses with a temperature above 102°F at any point in the previous three (3) days will be allowed entry. Temperature logs must also be kept during entire stay at the show facility and temperatures must be recorded twice daily. Cards will be provided in the horse show office. Temperature logs must be posted visibly on the outside of each horses stall and are subject to check by show management, veterinarians, and stewards. Horses that do not have up to date temperature logs will be asked to leave the property.

#### PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

• The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering Sonoma Horse Park Show both Showing and Non-Showing. These documents must be filed in the Show Office before any competition numbers will be issued. All required papers must indicate the horse's registered show name. This documentation must be submitted <u>prior</u> to arrival to <u>biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com</u> and hard copies should accompany all horses arriving at Sonoma Horse Park.

• All horses permanently stabled at SHP and showing at SHP must meet these Health Requirements.

• Any horse not accompanied by these documents will not be allowed entry to the property. Horses permanently stabled at REC that do not turn in these documents will not be allowed to enter the show park.

# **GR845 EQUINE VACCINATION RULE**

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

\*If bringing more than 15 horses, please fill out multiple forms. Please email all forms to biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com and ensure all forms accompany horses as they enter the facility.

Throughout the stay please minimize horse to horse contact and follow all biosecurity measures noted below. Early identification is critical when dealing with disease outbreaks, and this requires cooperation from everyone within the community.

- Complete and record rectal temperature twice daily. Temp logs must be posted on each stall door clearly and visibly for management, veterinarians, and stewards to check.
- Monitor horses frequently for signs of disease throughout their stay.
- Immediately report horses with elevated temperatures or symptoms of disease to SHP Management or competition stewards.
- All dogs must be kept on a leash or corralled and should have no contact with horses.

Please initial and confirm the following. By doing so, you are confirming you have read all the above requirements and understand they must be followed for EACH HORSE on the list you have provided.

#1 \_\_\_\_\_ I confirm each horse has current vaccines for influenza and EHV.

#2 \_\_\_\_\_ I confirm each horse will have temperatures monitored twice daily for three (3) days prior to arrival at SHP. If a temperature above 101.5\*F is detected, that horse will not be brought to SHP.

#3 \_\_\_\_\_ I confirm each horse has been in good health and has had no sign of respiratory distress or neurological symptoms in the seven (7) days prior to arrival at SHP.

All above-noted horse under my care are deemed healthy and show no signs of contagious health issues prior to entering Sonoma Horse Park. Any changes to health or symptoms of disease will be reported to SHP Management as soon as discovered.

**Daily medications that may affect temperature results:** bute, ketofen, banamine, dexamethasone, dipyrone, equioxx/previcoxx.
