

# SONOMA HORSE PARK

## EQUINE HEALTH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

**\*PLEASE NOTE\*** All health requirements may be fluid prior to the start of competition. Please ensure that the most recent health requirements are met. All requirements will be posted to the website and widely released with ample time to be completed. Email [biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com](mailto:biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com) with any questions or concerns. Management will closely monitor all health related information and consult with USEF and facility veterinarians to ensure the safety of all competitors. The following are the current health entry requirements as of publication of this document.

### **EVENT PARTICIPATION HEALTH DECLARATION – REQUIRED**

Signed by the owner/agent/trainer verifying that the horse has been healthy with no sign of infectious disease and has not shown signs of a fever above 102°F within 1 week of arrival. Required for all horses entering Sonoma Horse Park Show Grounds (both Showing and Non-Showing horses). Event Participation Declaration Form available at [sonomahorsepark.com](http://sonomahorsepark.com). This documentation must be submitted prior to arrival to [biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com](mailto:biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com) and hard copies should accompany all horses arriving at Sonoma Horse Park. A new Event Participation Declaration Form must be filed each time the horse enters the property. Horses stabled off the property that ship-in for their classes must comply with this requirement.

### **USEF PROOF OF VACCINATION FORM – REQUIRED**

Signed record from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

- Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Equine Influenza (EIV)
- Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)
- If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number.

### **PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

- The Equine Health Requirements are Required for all horses entering Sonoma Horse Park Show both Showing and Non-Showing. These documents must be filed in the Show Office before any competition numbers will be issued. All required papers must indicate the horse's registered show name. This documentation must be submitted prior to arrival to [biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com](mailto:biosecurity@sonomahorsepark.com) and hard copies should accompany all horses arriving at Sonoma Horse Park.
- All horses permanently stabled at SHP and showing at SHP must meet these Health Requirements.
- Any horse not accompanied by these documents will not be allowed entry to the property. Horses permanently stabled at REC that do not turn in these documents will not be allowed to enter the show park.

### **GR845 EQUINE VACCINATION RULE**

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letter-head stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

\*If your barn is bringing 10+ horses, please complete forms. All horse entries must be current with the show office at the time this form is submitted; failure to do so may result in delays with receiving the horses' back number.\*

Throughout the stay, please minimize horse-to-horse contact and follow all biosecurity measures noted below. Early identification is critical when dealing with disease outbreaks, and this requires cooperation from everyone within the community.

- Complete and record temperatures twice- daily on the provided log kept visibly posted at your barn,
- Monitor horses frequently for signs of disease throughout your stay.
- Immediately report horses with elevated temperatures or symptoms to SHP management.
- Limit horse-to-horse contact.
- Limit horse-to-human-to horse contact.
- No grazing horses.
- Avoid submerging the end of water hoses in water buckets.
- All dogs at Sonoma Horse Park must be kept on a leash and should have no contact with horses.
- Avoid sharing equipment including tack, buckets, and brushes.
  - If equipment is to be shared it must be thoroughly scrubbed between horses.
- Horses should have labeled dedicated water and grain buckets to avoid exchanging this equipment amongst horses.
- Do not allow horses to drink directly from the water hose.

Please initial to confirm or answer the following questions for EVERY horse noted in the above list.

#1 \_\_\_\_ I confirm that each horse has current vaccines for influenza and EHV. Please see below for the required vaccine format and submission details.

#2 \_\_\_\_ I confirm each horse above will have temperatures monitored once daily for three (3) to seven (7) days prior to arrival at the Park. If a temperature above 101.5°F is detected, that horse will not be brought to the Sonoma Horse Park.

#3 \_\_\_\_ I confirm each horse has been in good health and had no signs of respiratory distress or neurological symptoms in the seven (7) days prior to arrival at the Park.

All of the above-noted horses entering the Sonoma Horse Park are currently healthy and have not displayed a temperature of over 101.5°F in the seven (7) days prior to entering the Sonoma Horse Park. Additionally, these horses' temperatures have been monitored once daily for three (3) seven (7) days, and a Temperature Log will be provided to Sonoma Horse Park management at the time of arrival. Throughout showing at the Sonoma Horse Park all horses' temperatures and overall health will continue to be monitored.

All vaccine records must be submitted on veterinary letterhead and signed by a licensed veterinarian or organized using USEF Vaccination Form submitted information must clearly indicate each horse attending the show by show name and the dates vaccines were administered.

At any time throughout this show horses are subject to examination by Park designated representatives and/or State Animal Health officials. If after such examination it is believed that the health condition of a horse will place other animals at risk, the horse and others that have been infected/ exposed may be isolated in the designated on-site isolation locations, or, if necessary, require removal of the animal from the facility.

\*Completing this form with any false information will result in immediate removal from the Sonoma Horse Park grounds and a \$5,000 fine for each horse that has falsified records.\*
